BENJAMIN HOWARD BIOGRAPHY Updated Winter 2024

Hailed as a "standout" (Chicago Tribune) and praised for his "authenticity and smooth sound" (OperaWire), baritone Benjamin Howard is a rising talent based in New York City. The 2023-24 season includes two upcoming debuts: concerts of Handel arias at NYU Skirball, in collaboration with New York Baroque Incorporated and Doug Varone and Dancers, as well as Mahler's *Lieder eines fahrenden Gesellen (Songs of a Wayfarer)* with Orchestra Miami. On the opera stage, Benjamin most recently performed the role of Publio in *La Clemenza di Tito* in 2022 with Bronx Opera. Earlier this fall, Benjamin was thrilled to be named a founding member of New York City's Fourth Wall Ensemble.

Other stage highlights include Pish-Tush in *The Mikado* with Pacific Opera Project, the title role in *Don Giovanni*, the Count in *Le Nozze di Figaro*, Ping in *Turandot*, Speaker in *Die Zauberflöte*, Rapunzel's Prince in *Into the Woods*, and Connie Rivers in Ricky Ian Gordon's *The Grapes of Wrath*. As a concert soloist, Benjamin has performed the complete *Songs of Travel* by Vaughan Williams, the Fauré and Duruflé Requiems, Rossini's *Stabat Mater*, and Rodrigo's *Ausencias de Dulcinea*, among others.

A Los Angeles native, Benjamin Howard has been a Young Artist at Utah Festival Opera & Musical Theatre, Opera in the Ozarks, and SongFest. He is currently a baritone/bass in New York's world-renowned Saint Thomas Choir of Men & Boys. Benjamin received his Bachelor of Music and Musical Theatre Certificate from Northwestern University and Master of Music degree from the University of North Texas.
